Note: As an exception, foreign language (2040 and 2050) or Study Abroad credit may be substituted for this requirement.

Other requirements:

- 48 total hours in the major
- ***At least 27 of the 48 hours in the major must be advanced level (3000-4000 level)**
- ***At least 12 of the 27 advanced hours must be in the 18-hour concentration**
- 120 total semester hours, including 30 hours at UNT, required
- 42 total advanced hours, including 24 advanced hours, required
- At least 12 total advanced hours must be earned at UNT in the major
- Completion of the University Core, College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirements, as well as all degree requirements listed in the catalog.
- Minimum 2.0 UNT GPA and a minimum 2.0 overall GPA are required to file for graduation and to graduate
- A completed copy of a Degree Audit Request Form must be filed with the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences Dean’s Office for Undergraduate Advising in GAB 220 before the student’s official degree plan can be made.

Undergraduate Academic Certificates can be earned with the Social Science major to help focus on potential career interests.
